Objective: Awarded yearly by the Society for Developmental Biology (SDB) to recognize a developmental biologist who has made and is continuing to make outstanding research contributions to the field, and who is also an excellent mentor who has helped train the next generation of outstanding scientists.

Eligibility: Exceptional developmental biologists who are actively contributing to the field, and who will be able to deliver the award lecture at the SDB $63^{\text {rd }}$ Annual Meeting (University of Calgary, Calgary, Alberta, Canada, July 24-28, 2004). Candidates are not required to be SDB members. Two nominating SDB members are required for each candidate, and each nominating member should submit a letter explaining why the nominee deserves the award, listing the specific contributions to the field of developmental biology, and including the candidate's affiliation, phone, FAX and email address.

Selection: An Awards Committee of SDB Directors and members chaired by President-elect (Judith Kimble for 2004 medalist) will consider all nominations and will make recommendations to the SDB Board of Directors who will make the final selection.

Prizes: A check in the amount of $\$ 1000$ and a plaque with E.G. Conklin's image will be presented to the winner at the lecture. The travel and housing to the annual meeting for delivery of the lecture will be paid for by SDB, and the meeting registration fee will be waived.
